

Amendment to the Terms and Conditions of Your Investment with 1st Franklin Financial Corporation

The following is an Amendment to the "Terms and Conditions of Your Investment with 1st Franklin Financial Corporation ("1FFC")", Form 11/2021 (the "Original Document"). To wit, the Original Document is, by the issuance of this Amendment, amended only to the extent listed below. All other language, terms, conditions, obligations, rights, and remedies stated in the Original Document remain in full force and effect unless altered here. Further, the Consent conditions outlined in the Original Document also apply to this Amendment.

Section 11.0 Redemptions is amended to include the following additional term under Subsection 11.3 Commercial Paper and Debentures Only:

(27) **Retention of Funds for Early Redemption.** If you demand redemption of your Commercial Paper or Debenture before your Commercial Paper of Debenture matures, 1FFC will retain an amount equal to fifty percent (50%) of all interest accrued or paid on your Commercial Paper or Debenture since the date of the original issuance of your Commercial Paper or Debenture or the date of your last renewal, whichever is later.
